BACK TO SCHOOL SAFETY TIPS

PUT WASTE IN THE RIGHT PLACE. MAKE SURE ALL ITEMS IN THE BLUE BOX ARE RECYCLABLE.

From August 16 until September 9, Newmarket staff will be conducting random visual inspections of your blue box to ensure all items are recyclable. The purpose of this campaign is to remind residents of items that belong and do not belong in the blue box for recycling, while also identifying residents who are doing a good job with their recycling efforts. **Correction:** Please note that last week's ad incorrectly stated that one item could contaminate all items in the blue box. York Region's MRF sorts materials into various material types (e.g. paper, cans, glass, etc.) and anything placed in the blue box that is not accepted is considered contamination. Residents are encouraged to sort their blue box material properly and familiarize themselves with what is recyclable and what isn't.
