PRIVATE TREE REMOVAL PERMIT

A new Private Tree Protection By-law has been approved that will require property owners to apply for a tree removal permit prior to removing a tree on their property. There are no fees for trees that are dead, dying, or hazardous, however a permit must still be obtained to remove the tree. All fees will be waived until July 2022. This by-law will protect Newmarket's tree canopy as trees provide many environmental benefits such as removing air pollution, providing shelter and food for animals, reducing greenhouse gas emissions, minimizing erosion and more.
